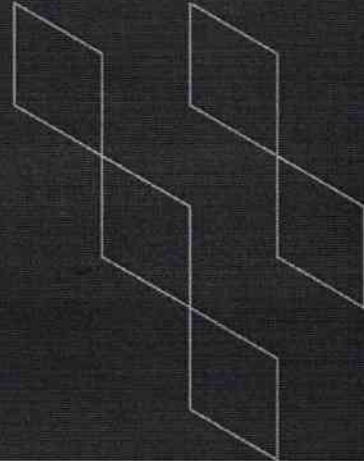

This holistic approach aims to equip learners with the linguistic and conceptual proficiency needed in medical contexts and collaborative environments.
